Leading the way

Our expertise

At Nurture you can feel confident that you really are in the most capable hands. We combine our patient-led, caring approach with world-class expertise, allowing us to offer hopeful parents the very best chance of building their family.

Not only that, but we continue to invest in research. Our innovative developments in reproductive ultrasound and applied embryology, as well as the introduction of a dedicated clinic for couples whose treatment has been unsuccessful, have been instrumental in the success of Nurture Fertility.

Advanced ultrasound techniques

Ultrasound is essential to fertility assessment and treatment. It's used to diagnose problems, to monitor response to treatment and to guide procedures. It's also used to confirm pregnancy and follow its progress.

Our own Dr Nick Raine-Fenning, who is recognised internationally for his work in this field, developed many of the ultrasound techniques we use.

Before treatment, a scan helps us to predict how you might respond to particular drugs, check for anything that might affect your chances of conceiving and give an accurate diagnosis of any anatomical problems.

During treatment, we'll invite you for a scan once or twice a week to see how you're responding to drugs and when you'll be ready for the next stage of treatment.

With the insights provided by these pioneering methods, our doctors can treat you as quickly and appropriately as possible to raise your chances of success.

Embryology

Our embryologists and andrologists have extensive experience in all areas of assisted conception and an excellent track record of success.

To ensure we keep delivering consistent results, the department is dedicated to ongoing training and pioneering new techniques. One example of this is our state-of-the-art laboratory, which has been designed to mimic the embryo's natural environment and so maximise your chances of conception.

Our blastocyst programme, which began in 2008, is also a key part of our success. By helping us to choose the very best embryos to transfer, the programme has led to with pregnancy rates as high as 70% in patients under 36 and in patients having single embryo transfers.

Other advanced procedures include the use of Embryoglue™ and Endoscratch, which can improve your chances of embryo implantation and pregnancy. We also use the Primo Vision Time-Lapse Monitoring System, a time-lapse imaging process that allows us to create a video sequence of developing embryos in order to monitor their growth more closely.

Comprehensive implantation screening service

Unfortunately not every embryo will implant, and while this is often due to the individual embryo it can also reflect an underlying problem with your womb, immune system or hormones.

Our comprehensive implantation screening service (CISS) is an innovative programme developed for couples who've had unsuccessful IVF treatment or experienced miscarriage. Through a series of tests we're able to identify whether there are any underlying problems, allowing us to offer either treatment or reassurance.

We're also one of the only clinics in the UK to offer an in-house endometrial biopsy, which allows us to measure the levels of cells in the womb that can prevent implantation.

We're working closely with several universities to better understand why IVF isn't always successful, and we hope this will enable us to offer you even more personalised care.



Genetics programmes

Chromosomal abnormality is one of the most common causes of unsuccessful IVF treatment. Our two levels of genetic screening help us to examine chromosomes, which contain genetic material, and check for any abnormalities.

Pre-Implantation Genetic Screening (PGS)

Chromosomal abnormality is one of the most common causes of unsuccessful attempts at pregnancy. If an embryo lacks or has additional chromosomes (a condition called aneuploidy) this has a serious impact on the chances of an embryo producing a baby. In many cases embryos with the wrong number of chromosomes spontaneously stop growing.

This is no less common with IVF treatment. However, with IVF treatment we can offer various levels of genetic screening to help us to select embryos with normal chromosomes. These would have a better chance of carrying on to produce a healthy pregnancy, without the emotionally devastating miscarriages that are so common when an embryo has a chromosome abnormality.

We are able to offer array Comparative Genomic Hybridization (aCGH) and Next Generation Sequencing - both techniques which look at all chromosomes in the embryo and select those that are chromosomally normal.

Pre-Implantation Genetic Diagnosis (PGD)

Genetic mutations are also a reason that many couples will opt for preimplantation genetic diagnosis as this is used when a serious genetic disease could be passed to offspring.

Two techniques are currently available - karyomapping and conventional PGD. We are particularly pleased to be able to offer karyomapping as, unlike conventional PGD, the embryos produced in an IVF cycle can be screened not only for the genetic mutation but also for chromosomal abnormalities - thus increasing the likelihood of a health on-going pregnancy.

Conventional PGD is used where the mutation is new and not present in either of the parents, or where we are unable to obtain DNA from other family members who have the same genetic mutation.

PGD can also be used where a couple have discovered that they have something called a balanced translocation or inversion, as a special test called HRaCGH can be used to select normal embryos.

Other tests are also available which may be helpful for couples and these can be discussed in more detail with the clinic.



Guiding you forward

Our treatments and results

Whatever the difficulty you're experiencing we've every treatment you could need, including ovulation induction, insemination, IVF, ICSI, cryopreservation, fertility preservation and both egg and sperm donation.

Treatment pathway

Step 1: Referral

All we need for a referral is a letter, whether from your GP, your local fertility clinic or, if you're funding your own treatment, from you.

Once we've received the referral, we'll send you a questionnaire to learn a little more about you and your story so far and, depending on your circumstances, we might recommend some additional tests. This will ensure we have all the information we need to plan your treatment.

Step 2: Initial consultation

When we've got enough information you'll be invited to see one of our specialist doctors. The doctor will talk through your case and advise you on the most suitable treatment and your chances of success

You'll also be given plenty of time to ask questions and discuss any worries you might have, so that you can feel confident about the next steps

Step 3: Preparing for treatment

Following your consultation you'll make an appointment with our nurses, who will talk you through your treatment, explain each step of the process and suggest the likely timing of events. They'll also explain how the various drugs work and show you how to use them.

Step 4: Starting treatment

Our nursing team will give you your treatment start date. Treatment often involves a series of different drugs, which you administer at home. We'll arrange several appointments for ultrasound scans and blood tests to see how you're responding, and most patients are ready for the next step after 10-14 days.

Step 5: Ovulation induction, insemination and IVF

The next steps depend on your treatment but might involve inducing ovulation, insemination or the replacement of an embryo (IVF). Visit our website for information about the different treatments we offer and what they could involve.

Step 6: The 'two-week' wait

When you've completed your treatment, you'll be given a date for your pregnancy test and might also be given drugs to support a pregnancy, which are continued if your treatment is successful. Throughout your wait, you're always welcome to call our nursing team to talk through any worries.

If your test is positive we'll arrange a scan a few weeks later to see how things are progressing. If the results of the test are negative, our team of specialists will review your notes and invite you to see one of our consultants, who will go through your treatment, explain why it was not successful and advise you on the next steps.

Bespoke Treatments

At Nurture it's important to us that we address the needs of every individual patient, and that's why we've developed and

introduced several new treatment strategies to provide bespoke patient care.

For patients who don't respond well to drugs used to stimulate the ovaries we offer natural cycle IVF, and we use modified protocols for women with polycystic ovaries and/or endometriosis. For those couples whose embryos need an extra helping hand, we can even offer supplemented cycles using specific drugs and time-lapse imaging.

For over 20 years we've also run one of the largest egg share schemes in the UK; we welcome single women and same-sex couples and have an excellent reputation for caring for patients needing egg donation or surrogacy. Whatever your specific needs, we have a tailored treatment for you.
